This morning we welcomed a group of 20 pre-schoolers to St John's for the first of four **'Leap into Learning'** sessions. The play based sessions are designed for children enrolled at St John's for 2021 or for those thinking about enrolment with us. They are run by our Kindergarten teachers with each session having a particular theme. Our next session, **'My Creation Station'** is being held **September 3rd** and will focus on using our big and small muscles. MacKillop Place in North Sydney is worth visiting, when the chance arises. The museum provides some wonderful insights into a life led by someone who was able to align her values and her actions for the glory of God. The chapel there also holds the final resting place of this great woman and is a beautiful place for prayer and reflection.

This October will mark the 10th anniversary of her canonisation. Mary has always been recognised as special by Catholics in Australia, but I can't help but wonder what she would have made of all the fuss of becoming an actual capital S saint!



There is another of her sayings that I find really useful when facing difficulties:

"Do all you can with the means at your disposal and calmly leave the rest to God."
