I return feeling refreshed and ready to take on Term 4.



This Friday, October 25th, we celebrate World Teacher's Day. We are truly blessed to have such dedicated, caring, professional teachers at St John's. The day provides an opportunity for the broader community to show its appreciation to these wonderful people who have a sincere interest in creating a bright future for our children, our Church and our country. A big thank you to the P&F for their thoughtful acknowledgement of our teachers.

On Monday morning, our Year 6 children led a beautiful prayer assembly which

focused on the idea of mission. We are each called to be the eyes, voice and hands of Jesus. Year 6 introduced us to the work of Catholic Mission Australia (CMA), an organisation who answers this call through their work with those experiencing poverty. 
We're running a Bunnings BBQ – Sunday 3rd November


